Music

Throughout GCSE Music students continue to develop key skills centring around: Performing Music, Composing Music and Understanding Music. In the performance element students focus on learning on intricacies of their chosen instrument and develop technical and stylistic features relating to genre and style. In composition students are encouraged to write with a distinctive character and the listening aspects complements the study through putting theory and understanding into practice.

AUTUMN TERM

During the topic students will:

- Develop an understanding of specialist software
- Learn how tonality can create and shape a mood
- Initiate performing skills relating to key aspects of the framework
- Cadences

SPRING TERM

During the topic students will:

- Compose within a chosen character
- Develop ideas harmonically and texturally
- Musical cliché

SUMMER TERM

During the topic students will:

- Modulations and sophisticated developments
- Application of dynamics
- Compound rhythms

After School Sessions:

Past Papers:

In the run up to the Music examinations, it is essential that students have prepared their instrumental pieces with their teacher and rehearse daily. Past papers will be set as homework activities and as timed exercises in class in order to thoroughly prepare our students for the final exam.
