Crime and Punishment c1000 – present

- **Crime, punishment and Law enforcement in medieval England** - Anglo-Saxon, Norman England, Late Middle Ages and The Church.
- **Crime, punishment and Law enforcement in early modern England** - Changing definitions of crime, Law enforcement and punishment, The crimes and punishments of the Gunpowder Plotters, 1605 and Witchcraft and the law.
- **Crime, punishment and Law enforcement on the 18th and 19th centuries** - Changing definitions of crime, Changing attitudes to punishment, Law enforcement, Pentonville Prison and the Reforms of Robert Peel.
- **Crime, punishment and Law enforcement in recent times (1900-present)** - Crime and definitions of crime, Law enforcement, Changes in punishment, Conscientious objectors in WW1 and WW2 and the Derek Bentley Case (abolition of capital punishment).
- **Whitechapel c1970-c1900: Crime and Policing the inner city** – Policing the nation, The local context of Whitechapel, Tensions in Whitechapel, Police Organisation in Whitechapel and Investigative policing in Whitechapel.

Spring and Summer Term

Weimar and Naz Germany, 1918-1939

- **Weimar Republic 1918-29** – Origins of the republic, Early challenges to the Republic, the recovery of the Republic and Changes in Society
- **Hitler's Rise to Power 1919-1933** – Early development of the Nazi Party, The Munich Putsch, Growth in Nazi support and Hitler becoming chancellor.
- **Nazi Control and Dictatorship 1933-39** – The creation of a dictatorship, The Police state, Controlling and Influencing attitudes, Resistance and Opposition.
- **Life in Nazi Germany** – Nazi policies towards women and youth, Employment and living standards, The persecution of minorities

Superpower relationships and the Cold War, 1941-91

- **The origins of the Cold War, 1941-58** – Early tensions between East and West, The development of the Cold War, and The Cold War intensifies.
- **Cold War Crises, 1958-70** – Berlin, increased tension and the wall, The Cuban Missile Crisis, The Prague Spring, Czechoslovakia 1968.
- **The End of the Cold War, 1970-91** – Attempts to reduce tension between East and West, Flashpoints in Superpower relations, The collapse of the Soviet Union.

Spring and Summer Term

Anglo-Saxon and Norman England c1060-88

- **Anglo-Saxon England and the Norman Conquest** - Anglo-Saxon society, The last years of Edward the Confessor, Rivals and claimants to the throne, The Norman invasion.
- **William I in power: Securing the kingdom** – Establishing control, Anglo-Saxon resistance, The legacy of resistance and Revolts of the Earls.
- **Norman England** – The Feudal System and the Church, Norman government, The Norman aristocracy, William I and his sons.
