Making the transition to secondary school

To help students take the step up to secondary school with confidence, our staff visit our partner primary schools, forging relationships and sharing knowledge to help each child understand Audenshaw School's high expectations of them.

Our Summer Taster Day and Summer School will give new students the chance to get to know the school, make friends and meet their Form Leader and the staff who will be teaching them. To help Year 7 students adjust to secondary school life, each form is assigned prefects, who are available to provide guidance and support throughout their first year at Audenshaw School. There will also be an opportunity for further parental engagement to meet teaching and pastoral staff at our Year 7 Progress Evening.

Support For Learning



The pastoral system at Audenshaw School is central to the development of our students. We provide a strong foundation of support in a caring yet disciplined environment to enable every student to achieve their full potential. We ensure all students can flourish in an environment that is safe and happy.

On a day-to-day basis, our dedicated team of Form Leaders look after students' welfare. Form Leaders ensure that all students are encouraged and supported to take an active role in extra-curricular activities, inter-form competitions and Leadership opportunities.

Each year group has a dedicated Year Leader and a non-teaching Pastoral Support Manager who work together to provide the very best care for the emotional wellbeing of all students. Year Leaders carefully monitor and track each student's attitude to learning, progress, achievement, and attendance and ensure those who experience difficulties receive the assistance they need. All students can access the support of the School's Attendance Officer, Mental Health Support workers, school nurse, and counsellor, if required.

In addition, our Learning Support Department is available to all students with special additional educational needs and is focused on enabling students to attend lessons and be fully included within school. We hold the highest ambitions for all students, including SEND students who have targeted support and bespoke plans in order to allow them to fulfil their potential.

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Our Inclusive SEND Offer

At Audenshaw School, we are committed to providing a fully inclusive and supportive experience for all students, including those with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). We believe that every young person deserves to reach their full potential—academically, socially, and emotionally.

Our dedicated SEND team works closely with students, families, and wider professionals to identify students' additional needs early and put the right support in place. For students with Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs), we ensure that our provision is tailored, regularly reviewed, and delivered in line with each student's specific outcomes. We take a student-centred approach: students and their aspirations are at the heart of everything we do.

If a student has an EHCP or is receiving SEN Support, we offer a range of interventions, adapted teaching strategies, and access arrangements to remove barriers to learning and promote independence. Our aim is to help every Audenshaw boy to gain the skills, confidence, and resilience they need to succeed both in school and in life beyond it.

The Learning Support Department consists of a Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENDco), An Assistant SENDco and a team of Learning Support Assistants each with individual expertise who act as key workers for our students with additional needs.

We welcome open and transparent communication with families and carers and are proud to be a school where inclusion is not just a policy, but a daily practice.

Taking Responsibility

Student Leadership

At Audenshaw School, we strive to offer all of our students' opportunities to demonstrate their leadership skills, to lead on change and to ensure the voice of all students is heard.

We offer an extensive range of opportunities that include roles such as the Prefect Team and School Council. These teams take responsibility for whole school charity initiatives; organising fund-raising events, leading assemblies, increasing community links; collecting and sharing student voice; acting as peer mentors, guides and ambassadors; supporting the management of whole school events, and helping shape school initiatives. We also have a Senior Prefect Team with leadership roles and responsibilities across different aspects of the school, these include a variety of the roles mentioned below. In addition, the Student Council have been elected by their peers to represent their year group and school. Throughout the year, there will be opportunities to discuss their ideas, to collect feedback from their year group discussions and then present them to the other council members who will then decide on and prioritise actions.

Outside of these roles, students are also able to demonstrate their leadership skills through the Duke of Edinburgh Award and by becoming Sports' Leaders, Stem Ambassadors, Language Leaders, LORIC Ambassadors, Literacy Leads and Well Being Mentors.

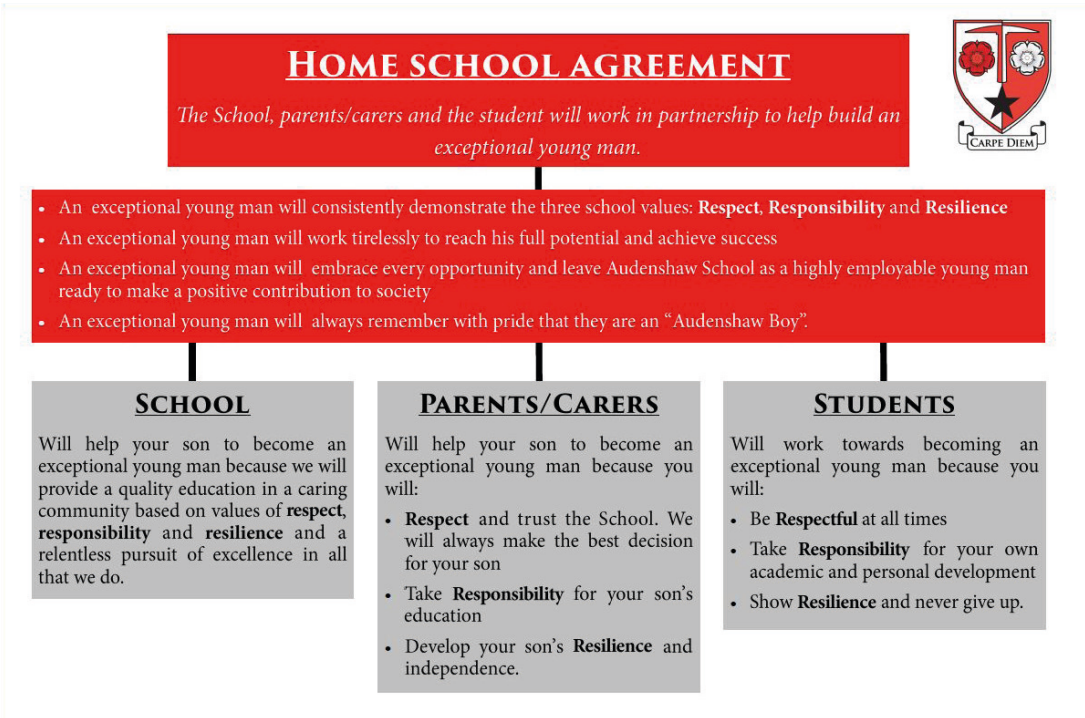

Our School Environment

Our Facilities



Audenshaw School students are encouraged to aim high, and our facilities offer a superb foundation to help achieve their ambitions. Fronted by attractive playing fields which provide the training ground for our highly successful rugby, football and athletics teams, Audenshaw School has 11 fully equipped science laboratories, 6 specialist Design and Technology rooms (including 2 Food Technology rooms) and 9 dedicated Information Technology suites.

There are specialist facilities for Art and Music, a fully equipped Sports Hall, professional standard gym, and an all-weather pitch which has played host to many of our sporting achievements.

Our school has had significant upgrades to our school's facilities. We have had a complete overhaul of our IT infrastructure, ensuring that both staff and students benefit from the best technology available for an enhanced teaching and learning experience. In addition to the inside canteen seating area we also have a fully furnished outside eating space. This purpose-built, all-weather area includes a takeaway pod, providing a convenient and comfortable dining option for our students. Additionally, we have made major improvements across the school site, including new roofs, upgraded heating systems, and air conditioning in key areas to ensure a comfortable environment year-round. Our school is also committed to community engagement. We open our facilities for lettings on weekends and after school hours, offering our space to local groups and organisations.



Charity & Community Work

Supporting Our Community

At Audenshaw School, students actively take part in charitable events and activities throughout the year.

We take great pride in our students' commitment to a wide range of local and national charities. Our student leadership teams vote on causes close to their heart and over the past five years we have worked closely with: The British Legion, The Ukraine Appeal, the Scouting Association, Macmillan, The British Heart Foundation and Tameside East Food Bank.

At Audenshaw School, excellent teaching and learning is at the heart of everything we do.

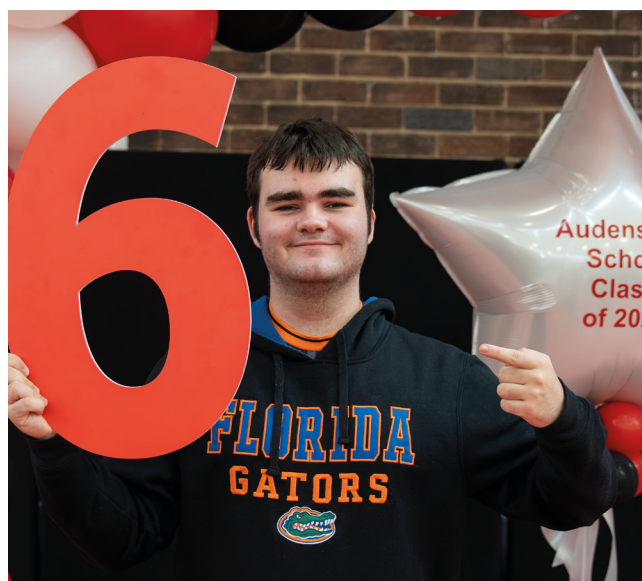

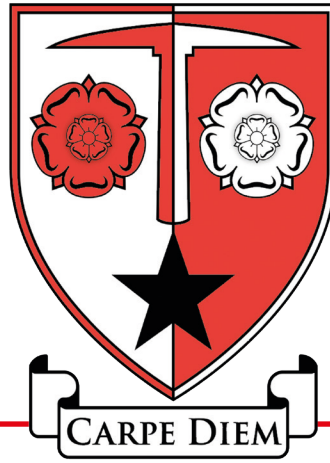
Our curriculum is broad and balanced with a wide range of subjects being offered across the whole of Key Stage 3. This offer allows students to build on their prior learning and be fully prepared when making option choices at the end of Year 9.

We take great pride in our students' achievements and in the way our young men leave us ready for the challenges that lie ahead during the next stage of their journey. History will tell you, our students typically achieve much higher grades than the national average. They contribute significantly to the wider world and are fully prepared to showcase their knowledge, skills and talents from now and into the future.

We work closely with each student to understand their interests, long-term goals and aspirations, and offer one to one advice and support to ensure that our students set themselves up for success. The vast majority of our students choose to go on to Further Education after their GCSEs, studying at some of the most competitive colleges in Greater Manchester such as; Ashton Sixth Form, Loreto and Xaverian colleges. Many of our students also attend Tameside and Clarendon College, The Manchester College and Oldham College who all have excellent facilities for the vocational subjects.

We hold dedicated days, throughout the year, for all students to consider their futures, explore how to write CVs and receive mock interviews centered on their career intentions. We track the students as they progress to colleges of further education or apprenticeships and receive regular updates concerning their ongoing academic successes. We remain in touch with former students through our alumni network who often return to school to deliver presentations about their career success.
