MUSIC

AUTUMN TERM

Instruments of the Orchestra

During the topic students will:

- Identify and recognise individual timbres of individual instruments and their role within the sections of the orchestra.
- Perform on the keyboard.
- Listen to and identify key features and characteristics of the orchestra across the musical periods, enhancing vocabulary and developing understanding of subject specific terminology.
- Demonstrate knowledge of Treble Clef notation and rhythmic understanding.

SPRING TERM

Ostinato

During the topic students will:

- Perform Tubular Bells on the keyboard.
- Listen to and identify key features and characteristics of the Ostinatos in a variety of compositions and genres
- Musically appraise using appropriate musical terminology and key words.


SUMMER TERM

Elements of Music

- Listen to, observe and identify key features and characteristics of STOMP music.

- Recognise features of STOMP and how ideas can be structured, shaped and developed.

YEAR 8 MUSIC

AUTUMN TERM

Chords

During the topic students will:

- Identify and recognise the tonality of individual chords and their role within sequences and progressions.
- Perform a chord sequence.
- Listen to and identify key features and characteristics of songs across a variety of songs and genres.
- Recognise how Major and Minor Chords are formed.
- Compose contrasting Chord sequences.
- Musically appraise chord sequences music using appropriate musical terminology and key words.

SPRING TERM

Blues

During the topic students will:


- Identify and recognise how the Blues has developed and the impact of which it has made upon the music industry.
- Listen to and identify key features and characteristics of Blues Music.
- Perform the 12 Bar Blues.
- Recognise the main features of the Blues and understand how they are structured and developed.

SUMMER TERM

World Music

During the topic students will:

- Identify and recognise how music from around the world has developed
- Perform World Music on the keyboards.
- Listen to and identify key features and characteristics of music from a variety of countries and cultures.
- Perform a piece of SAMBA
- Recognise the main features of Reggae
- Musically appraise World Music using appropriate musical terminology and key words.



YEAR 9

MUSIC

As part of the year 9 Musical Learning Journey exciting advancements and innovations within aspects of our curriculum feature prominently. As a focus on achievement some of our most able students are highlighted and selected to develop their gifts and talents in a selected and streamlined accelerated learning environment. - Recognise performance details

During the topic students will:

- Identify and recognise how Film Music has developed and the significance of impact
- Perform Hedwig's Theme on the keyboards
- Listen to and identify key features and characteristics of Film Music
- Compose an extract of Film Music
- Recognise the main features and characteristics of Film Music in contrasting genres
- Create a Film trailer
- Develop a television advertisement
