Crime and Punishment c1000 – present

- **Crime, punishment and law enforcement in medieval England** - Anglo-Saxon, Norman England, Late Middle Ages and the influence and role of The Church.
- **Crime, punishment and law enforcement in early modern England** - Changing definitions of crime, religious upheaval, law enforcement and punishment, the crimes and punishments of the Gunpowder Plotters, Witchcraft and the law.
- **Crime, punishment and law enforcement in the 18th and 19th centuries** - Changing definitions of crime, changing attitudes to punishment, The Bloody Code, law enforcement and the birth of policing, Pentonville Prison and the Reforms of Robert Peel.
- **Crime, punishment and law enforcement in recent times (1900-present)** - Changes in the definitions of crime, Conscientious Objectors in both World Wars, technology and changes in policing and the abolition of capital punishment.
- **Whitechapel c1970-c1900: Crime and Policing the inner city** – Policing the nation, The local context of Whitechapel, Tensions in Whitechapel, Police Organisation in Whitechapel and Investigative policing in Whitechapel.

Spring and Summer Terms

Weimar and Nazi Germany, 1918-1939

- **The Weimar Republic 1918-29** – Origins of the Weimar Republic, early challenges from the left and the right, economic problems, Stresemann and recovery and changes in German society
- **Hitler's Rise to Power 1919-1933** – Early development of the Nazi Party, The Munich Putsch, growth in Nazi support, the role of Hindenburg and how Hitler became chancellor.
- **Nazi Control and Dictatorship 1933-39** – The creation of a dictatorship, the police state, controlling and influencing attitudes, resistance and opposition.
- **Life in Nazi Germany** – Nazi policies towards women and youth, employment and living standards, the persecution of minorities.

Superpower Relations and the Cold War, 1941- 91

- The Origins of the Cold War, 1941-58 (World War Two, Atomic Weapons, US and Soviet Foreign Policy, The Berlin Crisis and The Hungarian Uprising)
- Cold War Crises, 1958-70 (Berlin Wall, Cuban Missile Crisis, Czechoslovakia)
- The end of the Cold War, 1970-91 (Détente, SALT, Afghanistan, Reagan, Gorbachev, collapse of the USSR)

Anglo-Saxon and Norman England, c1060-1088

- Anglo-Saxon England and the Norman Conquest, 1060-66 (Monarchy and government, towns and villages, the influence of the Church, the Godwinsons, Hardrada, Battle of Fulford, Stamford Bridge and Hastings)
- William I in power: securing the kingdom, 1066–87 (Submission of the Earls, castle building, resistance and revolt, the Harrying of the North and its impact)
- Norman England, 1066–88 (Church, government, resistance and William's succession)
